### **District Goals**

The Muscogee County School District will create an environment that focuses on Tier 1 instruction while targeting individual student needs, leadership development, and customer service.

# **School's SMART Goals**

- By May 2019, five (5) out of the ten (10) Tier 1 critical elements of School-Wide Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) will be at least partially implemented with three (3) of the five (5) elements developed to at least 85% fidelity based on the Tiered Fidelity Inventory (TFI) score (or Self-Assessment (SAS) Survey score).
- By May 2019, 100% of teachers will implement concept mapping and utilize teacher/peer collaboration in their learning and classroom practices with 85% fidelity.

#### What is Title I?
